I, like everyone else, will only be able to tell and share the last moments out loud and publically to those that are with me when I am making a difference. So make each moment count.




The spring of 2020 was not what anyone would have imagined it would be. I found myself the teacher and the student. 6th grade science and 9th grade independence will be forever in my mind.
